We were founded in 1984 by a group of volunteers working with the Huntsville Madison County Senior Center who wanted to ensure that food gleaned from food suppliers did not go to waste and instead helped residents at risk of hunger meet their most basic needs.

Program Accomplishments

<u>Feeding Friends & Neighbors In Need:</u> We supplied 7,125,020 pounds of food to 250 charitable feeding programs reaching an estimated 80,500 individuals at risk of hunger.

<u>Backpack Programs</u>: We partner with companies, churches and civic groups to provide two-day, supplemental meal kits to children who go without food over the weekend when they do not have access to the free meals served at school. This year we helped supply 90 different backpack programs. These programs provided 142,155 meal kits to children in need and meant young students arrived to school on Monday ready and able to learn without the distraction of hunger.



<u>The Hiatt Loan Fund</u>: The fund provides micro-loans to family farmers and entrepreneurs who create jobs and greater access to healthy food choices in underserved communities. This year the fund provided access to credit to six businesses employing 14 staff members. The Food Bank's Hiatt Loan Fund is operated by our non-profit partner, Neighborhood Concepts.

Farm Food Collaborative: The Collaborative is North Alabama's first local food hub helping family farmers sell locally grown fruits and vegetables to schools, workplace cafeterias and grocery stores. The program supports thriving family farms and creates easy access to fresh, healthy foods for the broadest spectrum of residents. This year we made 339,503 lbs. of fresh, local produce available in schools, workplace cafeterias, and grocery stores, impacting 44,000 students in Huntsville, Madison City, and Madison County. We facilitated \$145,678 worth of sales on behalf of family farmers like Clark Haynes, a third generation farmer in Cullman County.




North Alabama Food Policy Council: Fosters education, collaboration and policy advancements to support a more locally-based, sustainable and self-reliant food system accessible to all. The Council is a grassroots, volunteer effort open to all residents interested supporting local food and farmers. This year the Council facilitated a series of informal meetings between the City of Huntsville and community garden leaders, farmer market managers and other stakeholders that helped to inform a new city ordinance expanding zoning for farmers markets.

Food Distribution Report

During the 2013-2014 year, the Food Bank of North Alabama distributed over 7 million pounds of food to residents in North Alabama at risk of hunger through a network of 250 partner feeding programs.

The map below illustrates the food pantries, children backpack programs, shelters and other feeding programs partnering with the Food Bank today.



We distributed 7,125,020 pounds of food in 11 counties of North Alabama this fiscal year.


