The Food Bank of North Alabama is a private, non-profit corporation that primarily distributes food in support of North Alabama's needy, ill, children and seniors. We also employ proactive solutions to end hunger and poverty by supporting a more sustainable, locally based food system.

We were founded in 1984 by a group of volunteers working with the Huntsville Madison County Senior Center who wanted to ensure that food gleaned from food suppliers did not go to waste and instead helped residents at risk of hunger meet their most basic needs.

Feeding Friends & Neighbors In Need: We supplied 12,110,703 pounds of food to more than 200 charitable feeding programs to help reach the estimated 164,610 food-insecure residents in our 11-county service area. During FY21, we continued our drive-through mobile pantry model to reach those struggling with food insecurity and fine-tuned our programs for seniors and children to accommodate the pandemic's ever-changing restrictions. We have continued to look for ways to safely distribute food through new partnerships and collaborations. We held 100 mobile pantries in FY21 and safely distributed 263,518 pounds of food. Volunteers, city employees, property managers, local businesses and grocery stores all played a role in helping us get food to those who needed it.

<u>Backpack Programs</u>: We partner with companies, churches and civic groups to provide two-day, supplemental meal kits to children who otherwise would go without food over the weekend when they do not have access to the free meals served at school. This year we helped supply 71 backpack programs. These programs provided 89,283 meal kits to children in need and meant young students arrived to school on Monday ready and able to learn without the distraction of hunger.



<u>The Hiatt Loan Fund</u>: The fund served as the initial startup funding for the North Alabama Revolving Loan Fund to provide micro-loans to family farmers and entrepreneurs who create jobs and greater access to healthy food choices in underserved communities. These borrowers would not qualify for a conventional loan. The fund is operated by our non-profit partner, Neighborhood Concepts.

<u>Farm Food Collaborative</u>: The Collaborative is North Alabama's first local food hub helping family farmers sell locally grown fruits and vegetables to public schools, workplace cafeterias and grocery stores. The program supports thriving family farms and creates easy access to fresh, healthy foods for the broadest spectrum of residents. The Collaborative ensures fresh, local produce is available to schools, daycares, workplace cafeterias and grocery stores across Alabama. We facilitated \$549,694 worth of sales on behalf of family-owned farms.








The Good Food Project: From our most recent Hunger Study, we learned that 70% of families we feed have a household member suffering from high blood pressure, and 37% have a household member with diabetes. To address these alarming health disparities, we partnered with dietitians who helped us design menus and create recipes that will help the people we serve prevent diet-related diseases. Now we specifically make food purchases based on these menu designs. Our Good Food Project not only feeds people at risk of hunger but educates them about healthy, low-cost eating choices.

#### **Food Distribution Report**

During the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the Food Bank of North Alabama distributed more than 10 million meals to residents in North Alabama at risk of hunger through a network of more than 200 partner feeding programs.

The map below illustrates the food pantries, children backpack programs, shelters and other feeding programs partnering with the Food Bank today.



We distributed 12,110,703 pounds of food in 11 counties of North Alabama this fiscal year.


